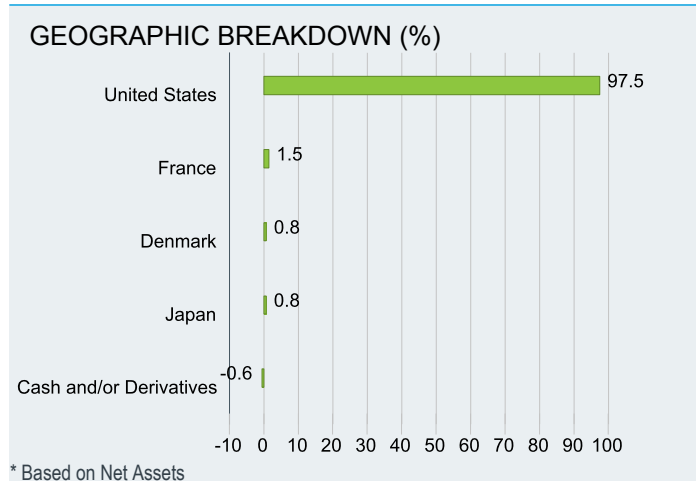
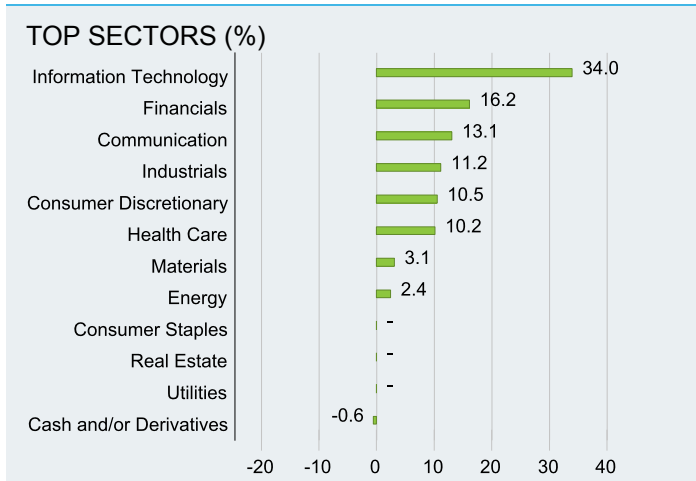

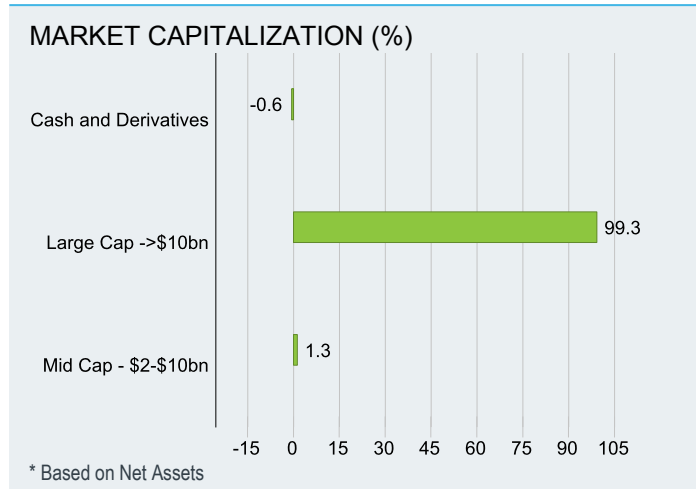

Credit risk may change over the life of an instrument and debt instrument that are rated by rating agencies are often reviewed and may be subject to downgrade. Interest rate risk refers to the risks associated with market changes in interest rates. Interest rate changes may affect the value of a debt instrument indirectly (especially in the case of fixed rate obligations or directly (especially in the case of instrument whose rates are adjustable). In general, rising interest rates will negatively impact the process of a fixed rate debt instrument and falling interest rates will have a positive effect on price. Adjustable rate instruments also react to interest rate changes in a similar manner although generally to a lesser degree (depending, however, on the characteristics of the reset terms, including the index chosen, frequency of reset and reset caps or floors, among other factors).

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GLOSSARY

Average Market Cap: The average size of the securities the fund invests in.

Distribution Rate: Distribution Rate is calculated by dividing the last distribution per share (annualized) by market price.

Type of Options: Type of options written to enhance portfolio returns

Percentage Portfolio Overwritten: Under normal market conditions, the Trust intends to write options with respect to approximately 30% to 40% of its net assets, although this percentage may vary over time with market conditions.
