Commentary as of 06/30/24

- The fund posted returns of 0.12% (Institutional shares) and 0.05% (Investor A shares, without sales charge) for the second quarter of 2024.
- Structured products, U.S. investment grade credit, and inflation contributed to performance, while emerging markets, U.S. rates, and high yield detracted.
- The fund moved to an overweight top-line duration (interest rate sensitivity) position relative to the benchmark during the quarter. This was done mainly by adding to the overweight exposures at the front and "belly" of the yield curve and moving to a slight overweight position at the back end as economic data softened. We maintained overweight positions in U.S. investment grade credit and agency mortgage-backed securities. Additionally, we favored seniority in securitized debt and tactically added to U.S. high yield credit.

Contributors

The allocation to securitized assets was the largest contributor to returns. Similarly, security selection within investment grade credit was additive, as we increased the overweight holding in the industrials sector and underweight position in the banks industry, benefiting from some volatility in April. The fund generally maintained its underweight allocation to the financials sector and modest overweight exposures to select portions of the industrials sector through the rest of the quarter. Additionally, a long inflation position in April contributed as breakevens (the difference in yield between nominal U.S. Treasuries and Treasury inflation-protected securities with comparable maturities) moved higher due to an upside inflation surprise.

Detractors

Duration positioning detracted, largely due to an underweight position in May as rates rallied on softer economic data. The move to an overweight duration stance was unhelpful in June as nonfarm payroll data surprised to the upside. Additionally, an out-of-benchmark allocation to high yield credit hampered returns as spreads widened in April given upside economic surprises. In the same month, an overweight holding in emerging market debt detracted, with select local rate exposures selling off as markets priced in the possibility of higher-for-longer rates.

Further insight

At quarter-end, the fund held an overweight top-line overweight stance relative to the benchmark (6.61 years versus 5.99 years). We continued to increase the overweight exposure at the front end of the yield curve as we believed the market's pricing of approximately two interest rate cuts by year-end seemed fair. The fund also moved from an underweight exposure at the back end of the yield curve to a slight overweight position, as the weakening macroeconomic backdrop lowered the risk of a near-term sell-off. Additionally, we are tactically rotating across select spread sectors given attractive opportunities, focused on seniority in securitized debt, and are cautious on emerging markets.
